1. review relative pronoun rules. (Stage 15 Objective Sheet)
2. nouns ending in –ius (filius), have a vocative singular with one (ī) (**fili**) and a vocative plural with two(ī)s (**fili**) which is also the nominative plural.
3. “fessus, fessa, fessum” means **tired**.
- 4.” therma” means **bath**.
5. modal verbs like , **possum** – be able, **vōlō** – wish, **nōlō** – not wish, **debeō** – ought, and **soleō** – be accustomed, **coepī** – began, **audeō** – dare, **dēsinō** – cease, **queō** – be able, take a **complementary infinitive**.
6. special verbs (intransitive) like **persuadeō**- persuade, **appropinquō**,- approach, **resistō** – resist, **praesum** – be in charge of, **faveō** - favor, **crēdō** - trust, **placeō** - please, **parcō** – spare, **serviō** – serve, **ignōscō** – forgive, **cōnfidō** – trust, **displiceō** – displease, **invdeō** – envy, **imperō** – order, **noceō** – harm, **pareō** – obey, **studeō** – be eager for, etc. take a Dative object instead of an Accusative.
7. A nominative noun or adjective after the verb “**to be**” is called a **predicate nominative**.
