superlatives

superlatives are the **ultimate degree** of an adjective. The most common way to form a superlative is by adding “**-issim**” to the base of the adjective before attaching the ending (biggest, smallest, tallest)

Some superlatives are formed with “**-rim**” instead of “**-issim**”.
