

Persons, Personal Pronouns and Personal Endings

Persons	English pronoun	Latin pronoun	Latin personal ending
	(singular)	(singular)	(singular)
1 st person	I	ego	-ō, -m
2 nd person	you	tū	-s
3 rd person	he, she, it	(a noun)	-t

"**ego**" is 1st person singular meaning "I" and **will always go** with a **verb** that ends in "-o" or "-m".

ex. **ego** matrem expectō. → I am waiting for my mother.

ego sum coquus. → I am a cook.

"**tū**" is 2nd person singular meaning "you" and **will always go** with a **verb** that ends in "-s".

ex. **tū** in villā labōrās. → You are working in the house.

There is no 3rd person pronoun in Latin and the subject will usually be a **noun** and **will always go** with a **verb** that ends in "-t".

ex. **Caecilius** navem videt. → Caecilius sees the ship.
