**DATIVE:** new uses for the dative case with word such as: respondet, favet, crēdit, placet

ex. servus ancillae respondet. *The slave replies to the slave girl.*  
mercātor Caeciliō favet. *The merchant gives his support to Caecilius.*  
Metella mercatorī crēdit. *Metella gives her trust to the merchant*  
Pugnāx Pompēiānīs placet. *Pugnax is pleasing to the Pompeians.*

**Interrogatives: (Questions)** - ways of asking a question

- question words:** such as quis - *Who?* quid - *What?* ubi - *Where?* cūr - *Why?*
- tone of voice** indicated by a question mark **Metella tōgam ēmit?** *Did Metella buy the toga?*
- ne** added to the first word of a sentence **puellane est pulchra?** *Is the girl pretty?*
- num** as the first word in a sentence creates a question **that expects a no answer**  
ex. **num vōs Rufī favētis?** *Surely you don't support Rufus?*
